Season's greetings

This is the third edition of the President's Quarterly. It is remarkable how time passes by so quickly. Since then not much activity has taken place in the association. Notwithstanding however it is important that the little be reported on, so as to keep the association constantly informed as to what has been happening.

Equity in appointment:

The association continues to advocate for the best for our umpires. We have dialogued with the WICB in regards to equity in appointments to officiate in matches. This came as a result of concerns in how matches are apportioned.

WICB Cricket Committee Meeting:

On February 12, 2012 WICUA President Cecil Fletcher attended the WICB Cricket Committee Meeting in Antigua, acting as a replacement for Hon. Secretary Vivian Johnson who is the WICUA representative on the committee, but who was unavailable due to Regional cricket match duties.

WICUA 50TH Anniversary:

WICUA's 50TH Anniversary celebration will take the form of a church service in June 2012 throughout WICUA's domain. Other activities are being planned for the period as well. WICUA are on high alert to effect the program. Already plans are far advanced as they relate to the secretariat work in this regard. It is important that our umpires support the effort wholeheartedly. Fifty years is a long time and as an association we have come a long way.

Finance:

It would be an understatement to mention that the association needs money. It is a given that funds are needed to plan and execute matters of grave concern to the association. The matter of exposing our umpires to constant training is at the top of a raft of things to be done. The land scape has changed dramatically, it is now a technological world, we need to keep abreast of modern innovations and practices, with a view of enabling our umpires by having them been kept constantly in the 'loop'. It takes money to be competitive and to be informed. It is money that will guarantee the constant flow of information. WICUA Report to WICB:

Since the last publication a significant task was undertaken by the Secretariat in submitting to the WICB a comprehensive Report which was being requested as a follow up to the WICB Umpires Committee Meeting held in September 2011. Some of the matters reported are :-

- •Request to WICB to facilitate WICUA Mid Term Meeting.
- •Request to increase funding to host WICUA Convention
- •Request for WICB to fund territorial umpires training
- •Request for WICB to train Umpires on the Senior and Emerging Panel at the H.P.C
- •Empowering of women umpires enabling them to do WICB Regional matches
- •Requesting that match passes be allocated to former and present regional umpires and to include WICUA current Executives.

Training Manual:

A guide to training is the ideal way for anyone in a uniform and structured way to approach a given task of learning or teaching material that are as complex as the laws and conditions of play of cricket. WICUA has seen the need for a uniform approach to the execution of training within our ranks. On January 22, 2012 WICUA's official document called "WICUA Training Manual" was officially rolled out and has been accepted as the official training manual. It took some time to be a reality. It is now with us. Heartiest congratulations to Clyde Cumberbatch and his team, who despite the odds, have come good and have delivered. It is for us all to utilize the document.
